6	A Cow Can't Fly	Learners will be able to identify common farm animals, and describe the animals' abilities
7/	I Go By Bus	Learners will be able to identify types of transport and say what type of transport people use to travel to various places
8	It's Ten O'Clock!	Learners will begin to be familiar with describing common everyday actions and time phrases
9	What Are You Doing?	Learners will become more familiar with descibing the actions that people are doing now, and learn more language about hobbies
10	It's Next To The Park	Learners will be able to ask for, give and understand information about the location of certain places in a town or city
111	Shopping At The Market	Learners will be able to ask and answer questions about quantity and prices, and learn more vocabulary about food and drinks
12	At The Beach	Learners will be able to answer questions about objects and actions that people are doing at the beach


